

The year 2017 began with a special celebration of Between Friends' 35th Anniversary. A lot has changed in 35 years, and we are proud to be delivering quality programs and services to more members now than ever before!

The growth that we have seen in our **Between Friends I.C.A.N!** (Inclusive Community Activities with No Barriers) Services last year was truly amazing. We are thrilled to live in a country that is now embracing what we have known all along, the importance of inclusion and diversity. We are proud to partner with so many community recreation providers who have solidified a commitment to inclusion, by working actively with us to ensure more individuals can access social and recreational activities in their communities. We are grateful for our funding partners: United Way of Calgary & Area, City of Calgary Family & Community Support Services, and Calgary Foundation, who have joined with us to help make our vision a reality.

We have also seen tremendous impact in our programs and services in the Northeast quadrant of the city. Through our last strategic planning process, we identified this as an area requiring attention. Many families residing in Northeast communities have children

with disabilities, yet that area was under-represented in our membership. Our Community Engagement Coordinator for the Northeast, Ashutosh Pathak, has done an amazing job building relationships to increase our membership and enable more participation.

Our Board and Leadership Team worked diligently last year to review and update our bylaws, ensuring that we remain current and relevant. The organization has also begun emphasizing leadership development to ensure sustainability. We review our strategic plan annually. As part of this process we always review our vision, mission, and values statements, to ensure

between friends Camp Bonaventure	A true outdoor summer day camp at Riveredge Park and our satellite Northeast camp at 1000 Voices at the Genesis Centre, where friendship and fun flourish for ages 4 to 17.

Connecting


Between Friends provides unique opportunities for individuals with disabilities to have social interaction with peers who may or may not have a disability.

Belonging


Our focus is on shared interests over individual differences. These shared interactions and experiences often become the foundation of understanding and lasting friendships.




Did you know that one of the fastest growing initiatives in 2017 was our **Between Friends I.C.A.N!** Services?

Between Friends I.C.A.N! Services allow Between Friends to see our "vision in action". This inclusive model helps Between Friends participants who have disabilities take part in community based programming throughout the city without the requirement of a personal support aide. Instead, Recreation Inclusion Facilitators work with the participants, families, and partner organizations to educate and facilitate an inclusive environment for all those involved in the program. Through **Between Friends I.C.A.N!** Services, we have seen tremendous growth in building capacity among community recreation providers by giving them the tools necessary to successfully provide inclusive programming.

- Between Friends grew from having 12 Community Recreation Partners in 2016 to 33 in 2017, a 125% increase!
- Our Community Recreation Partners include: City of Calgary, YMCA, Calgary Public Library, Repsol Sports Centre, TELUS Spark, and many more.
- Community Recreation Partner staff training grew from 13 individuals in 2016 to 280 in 2017!
- Our training impact grew from potentially supporting 1,100 kids (440 with a disclosed disability) registered in partner camps in 2016 to 18,994 people (563 with a disclosed disability) in partner programs in 2017
- The number of participants accessing I.C.A.N! Services grew from seven in 2016 to 41 in 2017, an increase of 486%!

Northeast Programs

Did you know that there is a large population of individuals with disabilities living in Northeast Calgary?

In 2017, in an effort to reduce barriers to accessing programs, Between Friends piloted two one-week summer day camps in Northeast Calgary. The camps, which were a satellite of **Between Friends Camp Bonaventure**, ran in July for children ages 6-12 and teens ages 13-17 at the Genesis Centre. **Between Friends W.E.S.O.A.R!** programs were also offered year-round. As of December 2017, we have signed up 52 new members from Northeast Calgary!

Randa, a Syrian refugee new to Canada, found almost no social or financial support in her efforts to adapt to a new country and provide for her daughter Ghazal, a child with significant special needs. Their family not only struggled to secure basic necessities such as housing, food, and employment, but they were also desperately trying to find an organization that would engage Ghazal in activities that would help reduce her stress.

When it seemed like all resources had been exhausted, a settlement agency connected the family with Between Friends, suggesting Ghazal attend the new Northeast satellite of **Between Friends Camp Bonaventure**.

The respite time Randa gained allowed her to give undivided attention to Ghazal's little brother, attend English language courses, and tend to other necessary errands. Participating in the Northeast Camp was a transformational experience for Ghazal; one that continues to have lasting benefits.



"The noticeable changes in Ghazal were amazing! Starting on the second day of camp, Ghazal would start saying 'Go, Mommy, go!' as soon as she reached the camp leaders and her group. She would come home and sing the songs she learned for her family."



Our events not only help us financially, they help raise awareness of Between Friends and provide our supporters with fun and memorable experiences.

Subsidies & Fee Assistance

Did you know that in 2017 Between Friends subsidized 40-80% of all program costs?

There is often a high cost associated with supporting a person with a disability. These additional costs may include special therapies, equipment, and respite care. Therefore, money for recreation is not always available. In order to ensure that all of our programs are accessible to anyone who wants to participate, Between Friends, through significant fundraising efforts, subsidizes the cost of all programs and provides additional Fee Assistance to families who need it most.

Without our Subsidies & Fee Assistance Program, a large part of our programming would be inaccessible due to the high cost of providing services for individuals with disabilities. Parents and family members often tell us how important our programs are for their loved ones, and how without these programs their lives would be very different.
