Message from the CEO & Board of Directors

Long before the unprecedented, global COVID-19 pandemic disrupted our lives, Between Friends was working towards an inclusive community where people with disabilities were living a life without isolation, without restrictions, without loneliness. For the past 39 years -yes, next year is the big 4-0!- we have been supporting people with disabilities to reach their individual potential and be recognized as valued citizens through our programs and services. Although we pivoted programs, introduced new programs and services, we remained the same Between Friends that each of you have grown to know, love and support.

When restrictions in Alberta were lifted this past summer, we pivoted Camp Bonaventure and offered Rec & Respite at reduced capacity and with different programming as well as virtual summer opportunities for those who may not have felt comfortable participating in person. We offered this program at four (4) community center locations, with one location in each quadrant of the city (NW, NE, SW, SE). Our fill rates indicated a high level of interest in our programs and the importance of community programming to our members.

In order to create the greatest impact for those we serve, we recognized that we could not get there alone. With the involvement and the feedback of our participants and families to direct our efforts and to help our community move closer towards inclusion, we made our Inclusion Training more intentional and we carefully developed a new service, G.L.O.W (Group Learning Opportunities and Workshops)

We truly believe that when recreation providers and community partners have the tools, skills, and knowledge to support the disability community then they will be empowered to provide equitable services to all. Before the development of our new training content, we facilitated focus groups within the disability community to prioritize content and topics. We also expanded our training team to include an Inclusion Training Facilitator with lived disability experience (make sure to check out Lionel's story) that has resulted in greater impact of our content, suggestions, and advice.

G.L.O.W.

G.L.O.W., which stands for Group Learning Opportunities and Workshops, is Between Friends newest endeavor. This program was funded through the "Change Can't Wait!" Grant, which is part of the City of Calgary's Mental Health and Addiction Strategy and aims to promote wellness at home, at school, at work and in the community.



With this in mind, G.L.OW. piloted in the fall of 2021 and offered 12 different personal development and wellness workshops for people with disabilities. Topics included Cyber Safety, The Foundation of Feelings, Building Boundaries, and Budgeting Basics. These workshops were provided to our adult members for free and offered a fun environment to learn valuable skills. We were overwhelmed with the positive reception that this pilot program received:

"Everyone who facilitated was amazing. The simple visuals and concise presentations made it easy to understand the topics. I'm impressed with how well Between Friends delivered... Given the success of G.L.O.W., Between Friends hopes to continue this educational programming for people with disabilities in 2022 and beyond. G.L.O.W. could also be expanded to include more age groups, and cover an even broader range of topics.



A Story of Advocacy

Lionel Migrino is an Inclusion Training Facilitator with Between Friends who has Cerebral Palsy and is an active advocate in our community.

Lionel's road to be an advocate for inclusion was not easy. Lionel grew up with his sister and a single mom who did not have access to resources to assist him as a child with a disability.

In 2011, Lionel was 18 and applied for his first job. This employment did not last long since "My employer did not see my ability, he only saw my disability"- says Lionel.

It was right then Lionel knew he needed to have a voice for all those who are under represented.

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It took a while for me to be comfortable with who I am. It's okay to have a disability, it's okay to be different.

In 2015, Lionel started his journey as an advocate. "I always wanted to have a voice to help others understand."

Lionel believes talking to people about barriers in the workplace for people with disabilities will help bring awareness and take action towards inclusion. 'How do we make our workplace more accessible?" This work will never be over, it's an ongoing journey as our world evolves.

In 2021, Lionel got a job with Pembina Pipelines as a Talent Development Advisor and just recently then hired him on as a permanent staff.

We created a detailed COVID-19 relaunch plan that served as a guide to our staff and participants. This document included logistics around physical distancing, use of PPE, and incident reporting related to COVID-19. We will continue to operate in accordance with the latest Government regulations and under the advice of public health officials. It is always our priority to keep Between Friends a safe and inclusive space.

2022 marks the 40th anniversary of Between Friends and our path forward is bright. From our humble beginnings as the Pink Pelican Club, we have transformed into the organization we are today; an organization that serves over 85 different disabilities, that has introduced even more locations for programming, and has adapted in the face of uncertainty.

We look forward to continuing to serve our members with disabilities, just as we have been doing from day one; with compassion, with love, and most of all with friendship, guiding our every step.
